## ORDINANCE NO. 92

WIDENING AND ESTABLIBING THE WIDTH OF AN ALLEY BETWEEN THE PROPERTY OF J.C. COSGROVE AND JOHN W. WALTERS IN THE BOROUGH OF SOUTHMONT, CAMBRIA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.

- Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa., and it hereby is enacted and ordained by the authority of the same, that the width of and alley extending from Marion Street to Chestnut Lane (formerly Clem Alley) between the property of J.C. Cosgrove and John W. Walters shall be and the same is hereby established at 20 feet.
- Section 2. That the southerly side of said alley shall be and the same is hereby established at  $l_{\parallel}$  feet south of the northerly line of Lot No. 22
- Section 3. That a strip of ground h feet in width, extending N. 71° 39' E. 10h.21 feet along the northerly line of Lot No. 22 and being a portion of said Lot No. 22, and dedicated for highway purposes by John W. Walters and Emma Walters, his wife, shall be and the same is hereby accepted and appropriated for highway purposes.
- Section 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be and the same hereby are repealed.
