

ORDINANCE NO. 81

ACCEPTING KING STREET IN THE BOROUGH OF SOUTHMONT, CAMBRIA COUNTY, PA., AS A PUBLIC HIGHWAY, ESTABLISHING THE WIDTHS, PROVIDING FOR THE GRADING, DRAINING, CURBING, PAVING AND IMPROVING OF SAME, TOGETHER WITH ALL SANITARY SEWERS AND INCIDENTAL WORK, AND APPROPRIATING THE MONEY FOR SAID GRADING DRAINING, CURBING, PAVING AND IMPROVING OF SAID KING STREET.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgees and Town Council of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Ap., and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of same, that king street from its intersecion with Dahlia St. to tis intersection with Daisy Street and Long Alley, within the limits of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa., shall be accepted and the same hereby is accepted as a public highway.

Section 2. That the width of said King Street shall be established and the same hereby is established at sixty feet; that the widths of the roadway and sidewalks shall be established and the same hereby are established at twenty-four feet from face to face of curb for roadway and eighteen feet from face of curb to property line for sidewalks.

Section 3. That said King Street from its intersection with Dahlia Street to tis intersection with Daisy Street and Long Alley, including the necessary highway intersections and returns, shall be and the same hereby is authorized to be graded, drained, curbed and paved with a reinforced cement concrete pavement or a concrete base with a Bituminous surface together with all necessary sanitary sewer, storm sewer, man-holes, drop inlets and other work incidental thereto in accordance with the plans and specifications and directions of the Borough Engineers, as prayed for by a petition of a majority of the property owners ininterest and in number abutting on said King Street, acknowledged on the 11th of March.

Section 4. That the Committee on Hihgways and Sewers shall be authorized and hereby is authorized to proceed with the advertsiements and completion of said work on the foot front plan in accordance with the petition on file for the improvement of said King Street.

Section 5. That one-third of the total cost and expense of grading, draining, paving and improving of said King Street, together with all incidental work thereto, shall be appropriated and the same hereby is appropriated and the Borough Treasurer authorized to amke payments of same from time to time on estimates prepared by the Borough Engineer and approved by the Borough Council.

Section 6. That two-thirds of the total cest and expense of grading, draining, paving and improving of said King Street together with all incidental work thereto, and the toatl cost of all curbing and samitary sewer, as provided by the Boro Ordinance, shall be assessed and the same hereby is assessed on the foot front plan to the abutting property owners.

Section 7. All ordinances or parts of oridnances in conflict with the provisions of ths ordinance shall be and the same hereby are repealed.
